

Reverend Thomas Robert Malthus laid out in his 1798 writings, An Essay on the Principle of Population, a theory called Malthusianism.



Malthusianism is a theory that population growth is potentially exponential, according to the Malthusian growth model, while the growth of the food supply or other resources is linear,

which eventually reduces living standards to the point of triggering a population decline. This event is called a Malthusian catastrophe.

China's family planning policies began to be shaped by fears of overpopulation in the 1970s, and officials raised the age of marriage and called for fewer and more broadly spaced births. A nearuniversal one-child limit was imposed in 1980 and written into the country's constitution in 1982





In July 2021, the Chinese Communist government removed all limits, shortly after implementing financial incentives to encourage individuals to have additional children.

The rationale for the reversal / abolition was summarized by former Wall Street Journal reporter Mei Fong: "The reason China is doing this right now is because they have too many men, too many old people, and too few young people.

They have this huge crushing demographic crisis as a result of the one-child policy. And if people don't start having more children, they're going to have a vastly diminished workforce to support a huge aging population."

A similar population issue, but worse.

A landmark study published in the journal Human Reproduction Update analyzed data from over 40,000 men across North America, Europe, Australia, and New Zealand. The results were staggering – a 52.4% decline in sperm concentration between 1973 and 2011.

The authors warn that the mean sperm count has now dropped dangerously close to the threshold that makes conception more difficult, meaning couples around the world may encounter problems having a baby without medical assistance.

And the decline isn't slowing down. More recent data suggests the trend is continuing and possibly accelerating. But why? What's causing this dramatic shift in just a few decades?

The findings, published on Tuesday in the journal Human Reproduction Update, serve as "a canary in a coal mine," said Professor Hagai Levine, the study's lead author from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem's Hadassah Braun School of Public Health.

"We have a serious problem on our hands that, if not mitigated, could threaten mankind's survival," he said in a statement.

The study, commissioned by the nonprofit organization The Club of Rome, predicts that if current trends continue, the world's population, which is currently 7.96 billion, will peak at 8.6 billion in the middle of the century before declining by nearly 2 billion before the century's end.

Japan's population is projected to lose 18.7 million people between 2024 and 2050. The population is expected to shrink from 123.8 million to 105.1 million, a 15.1% decline. Japan's population has been falling since 2011 due to very low fertility rates (1.42 births per woman) and an aging population.

The population of Greece is expected to shrink from 10 million to 8.8 million, a loss of more than 12%, over the next 26 years. Greece's population began declining in 2011 when the first negative birth rate was recorded. Greece's population could decline by up to 50% over the next 50 years if nothing is done to combat it.

So, the secular world was panicked about overpopulation, and is now panicked about depopulation.





A mother's influence stretches into every sphere of life, but many moms fail to recognize their value or impact. Less than one in five moms (19%) says they regularly feel they are "able to contribute meaningfully to the world.

 Along with gaps in community, anxiety and exhaustion are evident in the lives of most Moms. A strong majority of mothers says it is true "I usually find myself worrying about something" and "I feel tired most of the time.

 Faith correlates with stronger emotional well-being among mothers. Compared to non-believing mothers, believing moms are more likely to say they regularly feel "satisfied with my life choices," fully present," "able to meaningfully contribute to the world" and

"confident in myself.

 Yet ministry and resources specifically for mothers are limited in congregations. Just one in 10 U.S. leaders strongly agrees their congregation prioritizes mothers, and nearly half of moms say that their congregation "never" provides materials to help support them as a mother


Your Brain Craves Beauty, Here's Why


In a landmark 2004 experiment, researchers placed participants in brain scanners and showed them beautiful paintings. A specific brain region—the orbitofrontal cortex—lit up instantly. This dedicated neural real estate, sometimes dubbed "the beauty center,"

implies that beauty appreciation is hardwired into our cognitive architecture. Moreover, our brains recognize beauty in milliseconds, long before conscious thought has time to form. This instantaneous recognition hints that we simply know beauty when we see it.

The Golden Ratio in Nature and Classical Art








